


More Than Ever Before

- Optional interconnectivity with learning management systems (LMSs) for access and completion of training from a single source
- Unprecedented flexibility to be adapted to any training specialty with minimal cost and time, by requiring only an electronic copy of each specialty's CFETP
- Elimination of hand-carried records, allowing for the instantaneous reassignment of a training record for PCS or forward deployment
